Afternoon


The guests will transfer 75 minutes to their Highland Perthshire accommodation: Dunkeld House Hotel.

Morning

MORNING ACTIVITY GUIDED TOUR OF BLAIR CASTLE

Discover Blair Castle, the ancient seat of the Dukes and Earls of Atholl and home to Europe's last remaining private army, the Atholl Highlanders.

Blair Castle is nestled in the dramatic landscape of Highland Perthshire and has been home to 19 generations of Stewarts and Murrays of Atholl.

Unique amongst Scottish castles, the story told here will take you from a visit by Mary Queen of Scots to the Civil War and from the Jacobite cause to the disaster of Culloden following Bonnie Prince Charlie's own stay in the castle.

Blair Castle is home to Europe's only surviving private army, the Atholl Highlanders. More than 30 rooms are on display, full of Scottish cultural history, architectural design, period furnishings, family portraits, landscape paintings and a colourful military past.

Highlights include the Victorian Ballroom which is decorated with 175 pairs of antlers, the Entrance Hall which features weapons used at the Battle of Culloden, the classic Georgian styling of the Picture Staircase and the grandeur of the Drawing Room and State Dining Room.









MORNING ACTIVITY HOUSE OF BRUAR

The House of Bruar sits like a castle at the foot of the spectacular Bruar Falls, and is widely acknowledged as Scotland's most prestigious independent store.

With inspiration from the beautiful Highland surroundings The House of Bruar design a range of luxurious Saxonny and Shetland tweeds with knitwear to match.

Home to Britain's largest Cashmere Hall, Ladies wear, Menswear, Home & Garden, The House of Bruar is unsurpassed for value and quality.

AFTERNOON ACTIVITY FALLS OF BRUAR

After lunch at The House of Bruar, visit the Bruar Falls as Robert Burns did in 1787. The Falls of Bruar are a series of waterfalls on the Bruar Water and there are two routes to explore these beautiful gorges- a superb excursion!

In the words of Robert Burns.
"exceedingly picturesque and beautiful"

This has been a prime beauty spot for over 200 years. today a natural canopy is provided by a mixture of mixed larch and Scots pine trees on this wonderful woodland walk.









AFTERNOON ACTIVITY EDRADOUR DISTILLERY

This little distillery steeped in history and quietly producing world class whisky is as unassuming and as natural as the fields and sky surrounding it.

The group will take a VIP Tour through the production areas learning about the process of making Whisky, and just what gives Scotch Whisky its special flavours – be prepared for an explosion of aromas!

Of course, no visit to a whisky distillery is complete without a taste and guests will be offered a taste of Lowland Malt Whisky's with a tutor to talk them through each experience.

The group will then have the opportunity to purchase Whisky from the distillery shop to take home as a memento of their visit to Scotland.







QUEENS VIEW, PITLOCHRY

On return to he Hotel the coach will stop at a famous vantage point, the Queens view at Loch Tummel. One of the most photographed areas in Scotland, rumoured to have been named after Queen Victoria, following her visit to the area in 1866. This is a fantastic photograph opportunity for the guests.









PRIVATE DINNER AT EAST HAUGH HOUSE

Built originally as part of the Atholl Estate some 350 years ago, East Haugh House is a beautiful turreted stone house with woodland walks and breath-taking scenery.

This family run hotel has a stunning restaurant that specialises in local game and seafood.

The warm and friendly atmosphere is not to be missed!



MORNING ACTIVITY PRIVATE GUIDED TOUR OF SCONE PALACE AND GROUNDS

Scone is a place that breathes history like nowhere else in Scotland. Today, in the 21st century, it is the home of the Earls of Mansfield, and a major attraction to visitors from all over the world.

Fifteen hundred years ago, it was the capital of the Pictish kingdom and the centre of the ancient Celtic church. In the intervening centuries, it has been the seat of parliaments and the crowning place of Kings. It has housed the Stone of Destiny and been immortalised in Shakespeare's Macbeth.

Poised above the River Tay, the Palace overlooks the routes north to the Highlands and east through Strathmore to the coast. The Grampian mountains form a distant backdrop, and across the river stands the city of Perth.

Two thousand years ago, the Romans camped here, at the very limit of their empire. They never defeated the warlike Picts, who later came to rule Scone, but the followers of St Columba had more success. By the early 7th century, a group of early Christians, the Culdees or servants of God, had established themselves here.

A tour of the Palace & grounds take approximately one hour & 45 minutes and this will be followed by lunch in the Murray Suite, located in the private wing of the Palace.









AFTERNOON ACTIVITY

After lunch the guests will transfer 45 minutes to Edinburgh, crossing the iconic & brand new Queensferry Crossing.

The Coach will take a detour through South Queensferry for a photograph opportunity of the famous '3 Bridges' before arriving at the Hotel late afternoon for check in & relaxation.

The Forth Bridges are an impressive sight as they across the Firth of Forth, providing the main transport links between the coasts of Edinburgh and Fife.



It is reputed that more witches were put to death on Castlehill during the reign of James VI than anywhere else in Scotland and the area around the Witchery by the Castle remains deep in history.

This lavishly furnished venue awaits the guests, its gothic touches, velvet-lined walls and flamboyant red and gold décor indicative of the style.

The impressive restaurant showcases fine Scottish dishes in opulent and magical surroundings and has built a world-wide reputation for its exceptional dining experiences.







Guests can also enjoy the view from the Castle overlooking the capital city.


The guides will lead the guests on foot to the New Town where they will have lunch at The Dome.

LUNCH AT THE DOME

The Dome stands out like a precious gem in Edinburgh's New Town. The building is littered with marble, mosaic and the impressive glass-coffered dome from a bygone era.

A warm welcome will greet the guests as they are seated beneath the huge glass dome to dine. Formally a Physician's hall and a commercial bank, The Grill Room Restaurant, still sparkles as brightly today, as it did the day it was built.





AFTERNOON ACTIVITIES

After lunch the Men will be taken to the local Kilt Store to be measured for their Gala dinner kilts. The guests will then have time at leisure to explore the city centre.

Alternatively we can arrange a Bagpipe Workshop or a guided tour of The Royal Botanical Gardens.

A tour for gardeners and garden lovers alike, this tranquil haven just a stone's throw from the city centre and known locally as 'The Botanics', is set in over 70 acres of beautifully landscaped grounds and captures the imagination of everyone who visits.

Highlights include the stunning Rock Garden, home to 5,000 alpine plants, the world famous Glasshouses with exotics and amazing Giant Victorian Water Lilies and the Queen Mother's Memorial Garden, a tribute to a much-loved royal.

The Royal Botanic Garden Edinburgh was established in 1670 and during the 20th century acquired three Regional Gardens – the mountainous Benmore in Argyll; Dawyck in the wooded hills of the Scottish Borders and Logan on the Gulf Stream-warmed southern peninsula of Dumfries & Galloway.

Together they represent one of the world's largest living collections of plants.







AFTERNOON ACTIVITIES

Louise Marshall is very proud to be the official Piper to The Lord Provost of Edinburgh and loves to promote Scottish music, Culture and Tradition. She is extremely passionate about her instrument and also hosts Bagpipe workshops. During the workshop, she pipes in full traditional Highland dress and once seated, all guests are given a chanter as well as music with the scale/tune (Auld Lang Syne).

She then introduces guests to the basic scale and the first few notes/embellishments required to play the first line of Auld Lang Syne on the practice chanter - this is always great fun as well as being very informative!

Throughout the workshop, she introduces some fun Scottish/tartan for guests to wear - should they so wish, including sporrans, glengarries, feather bonnets, plaids and kilts. She always find guests are up for this! Louise then invites guests up to try and play the first few notes of Auld Lang Syne on the bagpipes, wearing their tartan wear and she forms a 6 or 8 piece band with all the guests playing their instruments, including pipes, chanters and percussive instruments.

As a grand finale the entire group plays 'We will rock you' This really is a truly unique fun Scottish experience! Guests are then issues with a Bagpipe certificate and a small Scottish gift to take home.

This is an extremely fun and exciting 1 hour activity!

PRIVATE GUIDED TOUR OF THE PALACE OF HOLYROODHOUSE



The Palace of Holyroodhouse stands in a spectacular setting at the foot of The Royal mile in Edinburgh. Holyroodhouse is a working Royal Palace and a centre for national life whenever members of the Royal family are resident.

The Queen's Gallery at the Palace of also hosts a programme of changing exhibitions from the Royal Collection which the guests can view.






PRIVATE LUNCH AT PRESTONFIELD HOUSE

Prestonfield House was originally built in 1687 by architect Sir William Bruce, and was once a wealthy rural estate, but in recent decades has come to serve as a luxury hotel.

Prestonfield is a very personal creation, a fusion of historic architecture with an extensive collection of art and antiques and décor every bit as rich and colourful as the history of the house itself.

The guests will have exclusive use of The Garden Room. The Garden Room is bright and elegant, and is the largest and most flexible of Prestonfield's private rooms with its charming hand-painted chinoiserie walls and French doors onto a private terrace. An abundance of space and a discreet location makes the Garden Room ideal for the private dinner.











AFTERNOON ACTIVITY PICKERING'S GIN PRIVATE TOUR AND TASTING AT SUMMERHALL

Pickering's is lovingly created by its founders, Marcus Pickering and Matthew Gammell. Business partners for 12 years. Friends for even longer.

Summerhall Distillery is housed on the site of an old animal hospital. Part of a veterinary school known locally as the Dick Vet. Now it's an arts venue called Summerhall featuring a pub called The Royal Dick. The Distillery is adjacent to the pub. Edinburgh's first exclusive gin distillery in over 150 years. Where they produce their small batches of hand crafted, beautifully balanced, marvellously mixed Pickering's Gin.

The group will see how hand crafted, small batch gin is made. They can marvel at the botanicals room and the still and bottling line. They will sample all three Pickering's gin expressions and enjoy a Pickering's & Tonic from the gin tap at The Royal Dick bar.
